Rebuilding a Better Berkeley

Chapter 125: The Policy, Standards of Conduct, and Disclosure of Interest was reviewed.

American Rescue Plan Act: Subtitle M – Coronavirus State and Local Fiscal Recovery Funds was discussed. The council want the City Manager to investigate and put in a report how the following items can be accomplished using the American Rescue Plan Act recovery funds.

- Completely repair the streets and curbing that are in the most need.
- Complete a survey on which streets speed humps will be most useful and what kind. Concrete barriers used on certain streets and/or entrances.
- Improving the city hall safety by installing a kiosk for payments, a permanent scanner at the entrance, and the necessary of a permanent temperature reader and automatic sanitizer dispenser.
- Installing shot spotter cameras in hot spot areas and high resolution with night vision cameras in the parks with cloud base storage.
- A structure where the youth council can hold their meetings. Check with the school district to see if they can allow one of their structures for evening events and after school activities.

Councilwoman Hoskins left the meeting at 2:59 pm.

Councilwoman Williams left the meeting at 2:46 pm.

Councilwoman-at-Large Greene moved, Councilwoman Anthony seconded, and the motion carried to adjourn at 3:03 pm.
